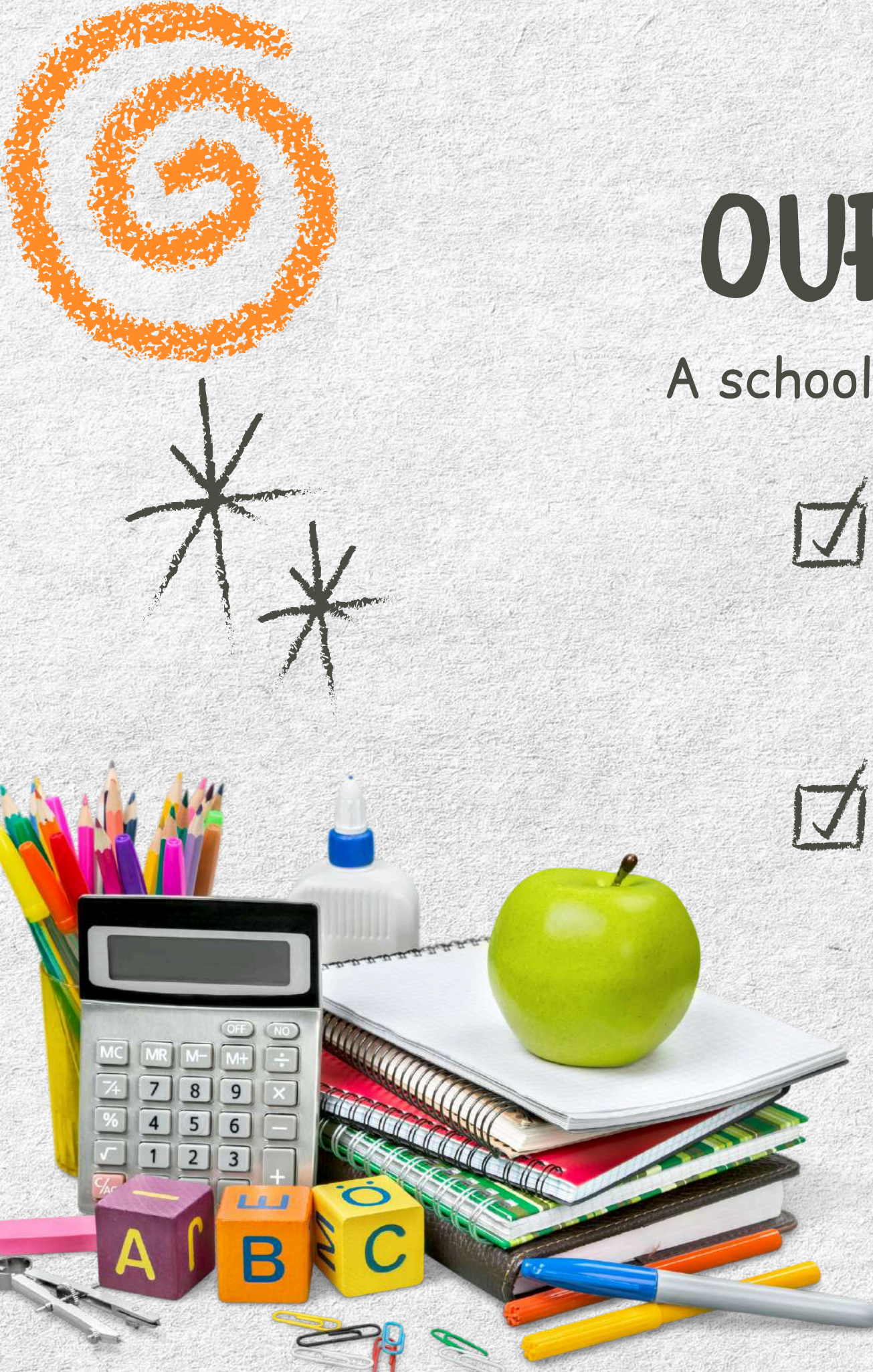

A school that listens, mentors, and nurtures

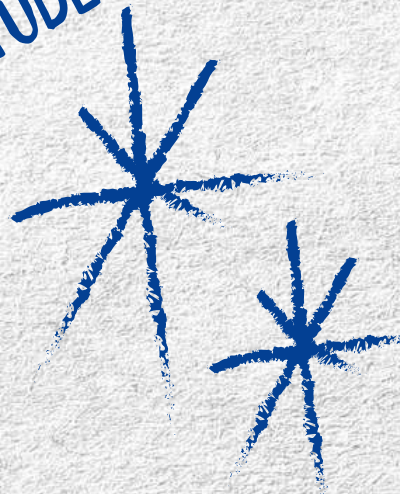
- We are a Lower Secondary School and welcome students aged 6 to 14. We offer a three-year program that completes the First Cycle of Education

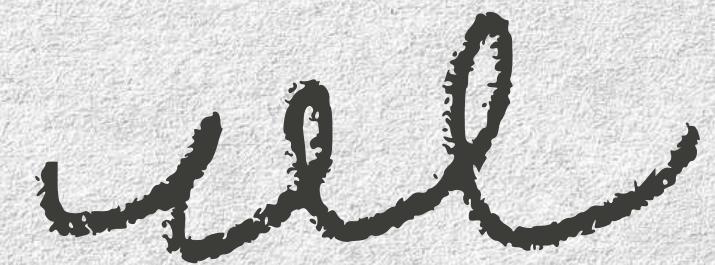




SCHOOL TIMETABLE

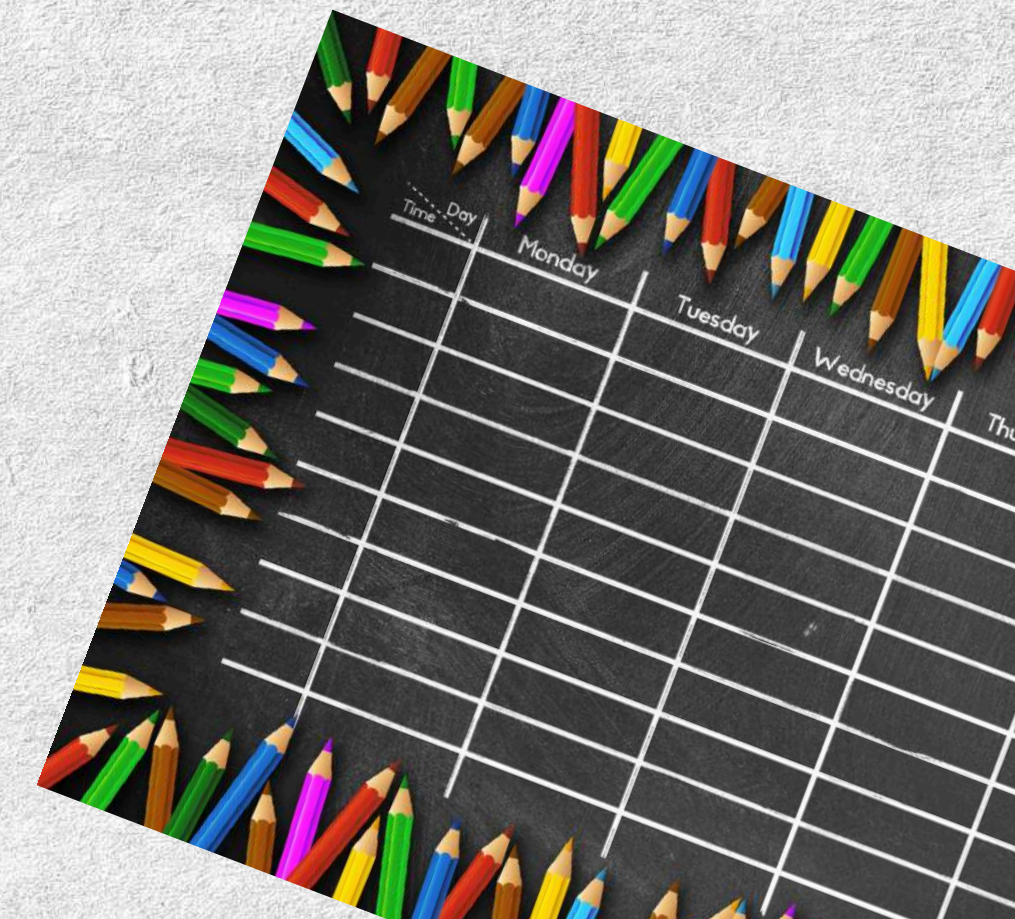


30 hours per week over 5 days, from Monday to Friday.

MATHS AND SCIENCE

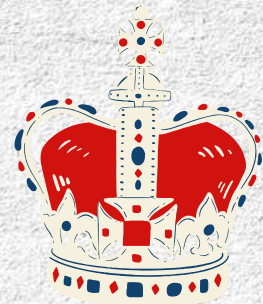
Mathematics focuses on strengthening arithmetic and geometric foundations while introducing concepts such as fractions, proportions, equations, and functions. Students develop logical thinking through problem-solving and practical applications, with an in-depth study of plane and solid geometry.

Science explores the natural world and the laws that govern it: from human biology and ecology to basic chemistry and physics. Hands-on experiments and lab activities help students observe scientific phenomena, while topics like astronomy and microscopy spark curiosity about the universe and the microscopic world.

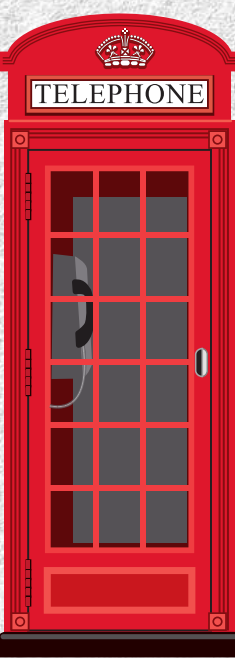




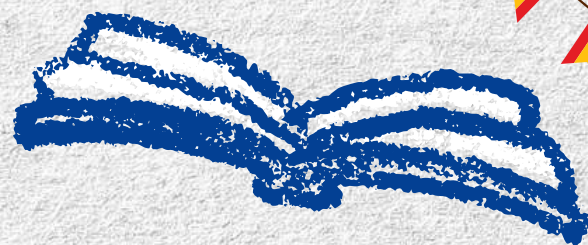
ENGLISH

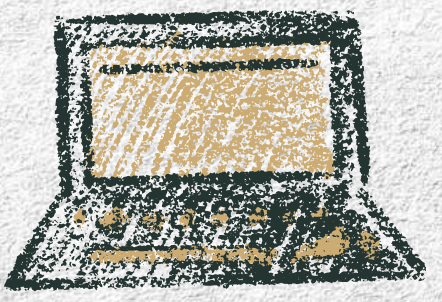


SPANISH

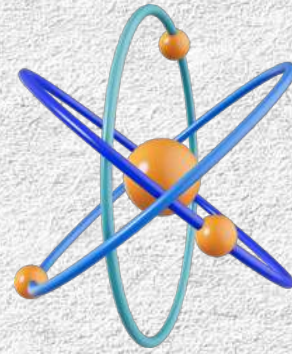

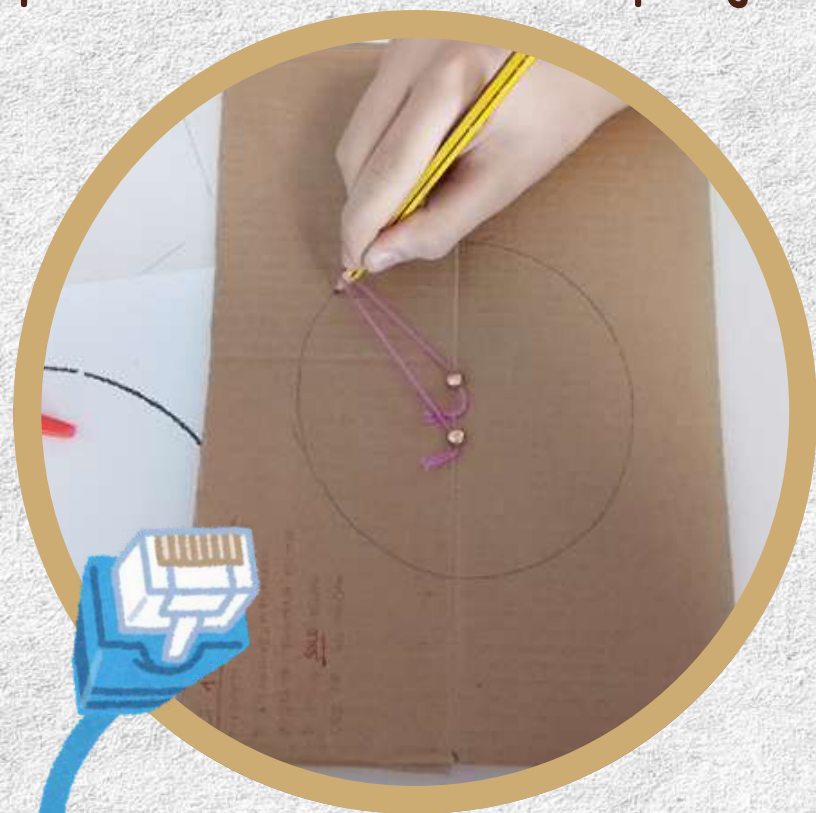
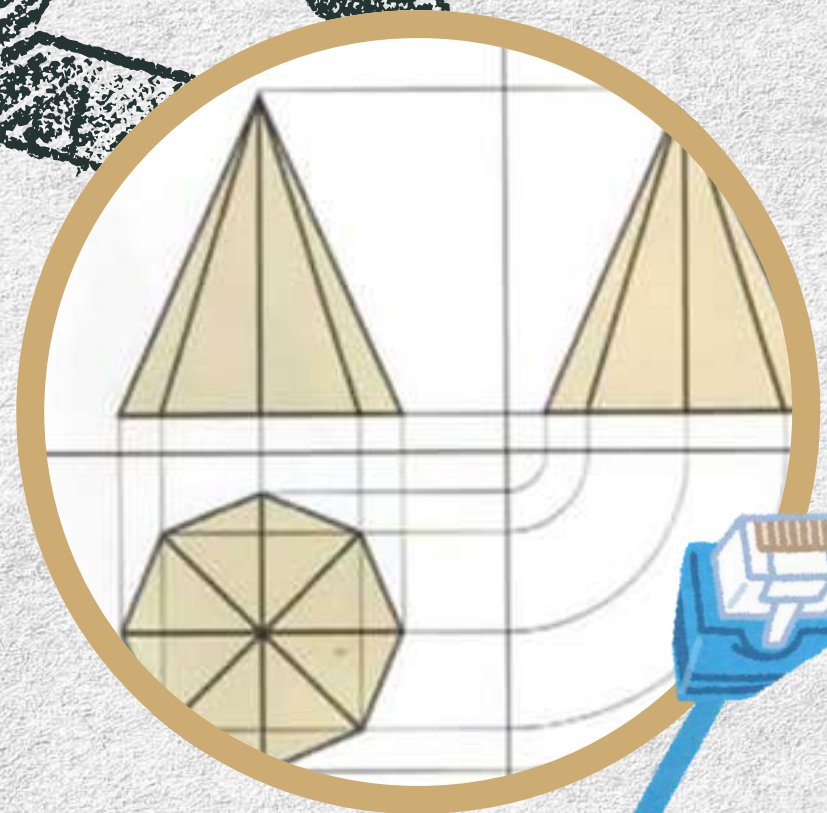


TECHNOLOGY



Theory and Practice

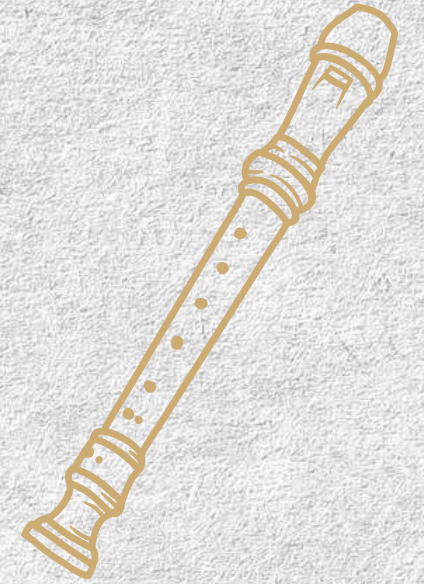
The curriculum is divided into theory and practice: students gain an in-depth understanding of materials and production processes, while developing their skills in technical drawing and graphic design. MUSIC



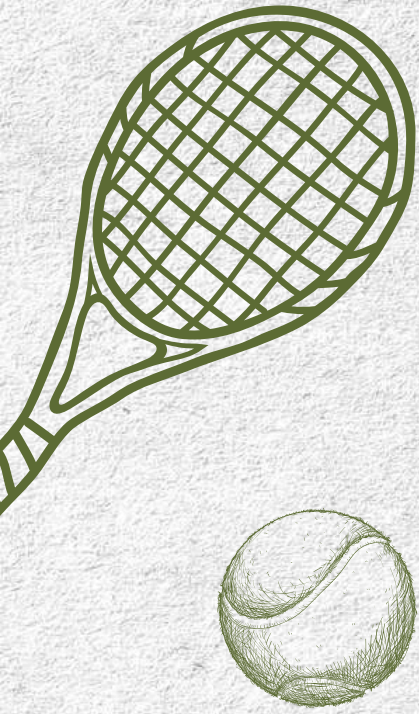

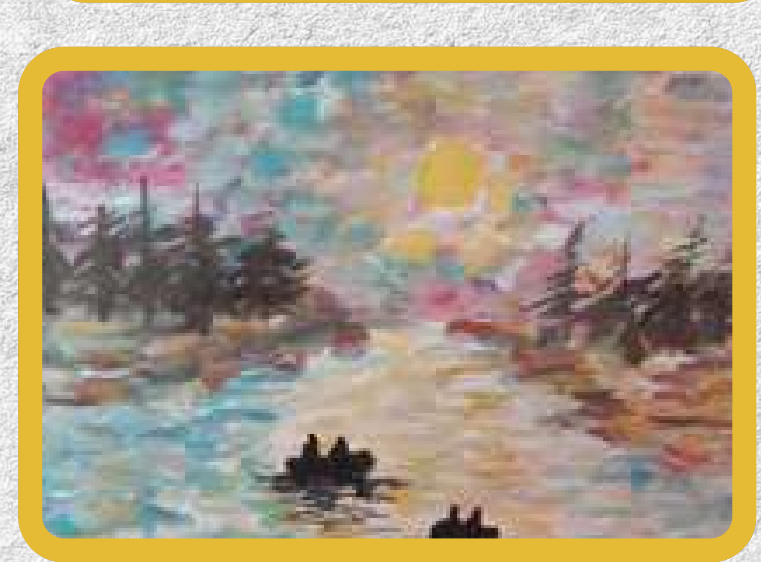
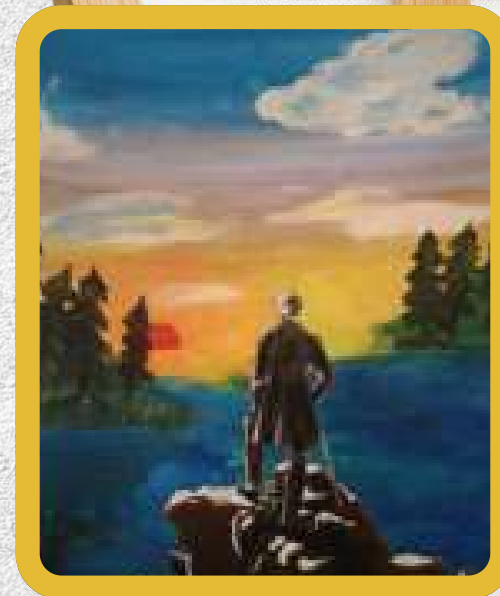
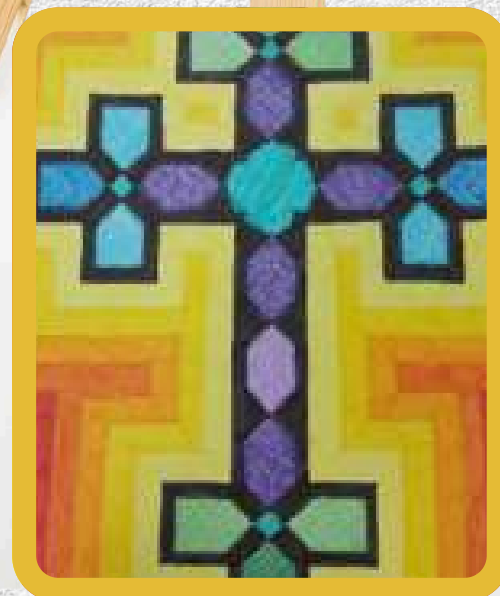
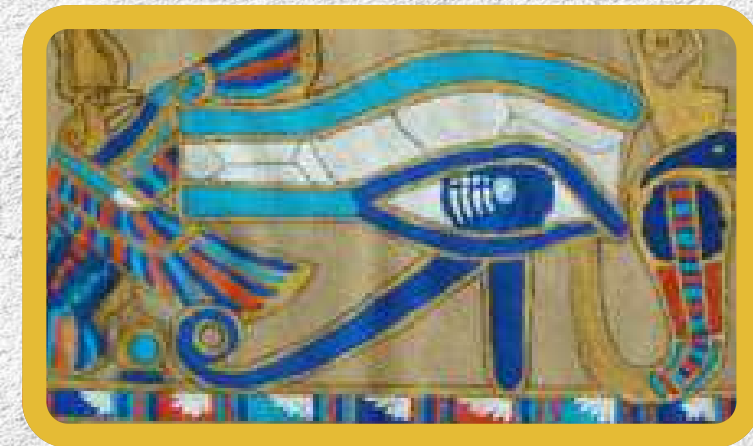
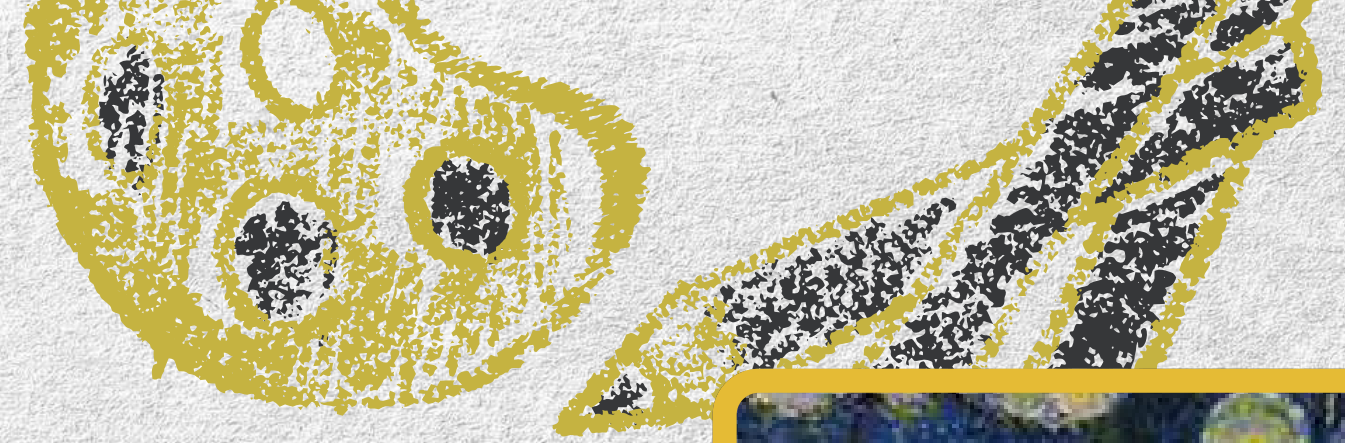


ART

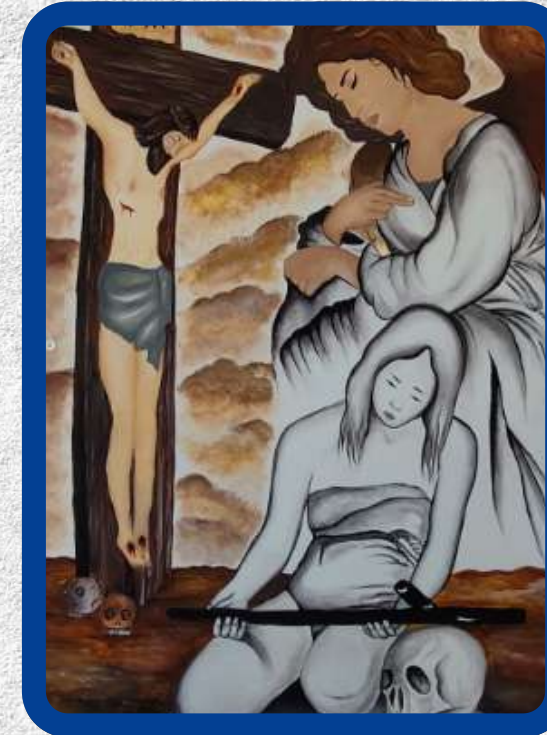
Art is divided into both theory and practice.

1ST PERFORMING ARTS HUB OF THE PROVINCE OF VICENZA

In June 27, 2025, our institute became part of the first artistic-performative orientation Hub in the Province of Vicenza. This hub includes other comprehensive institutes in the area, with “Comprensivo 10” serving as the lead school. It was created with the goal of promoting the development of integrated artistic pathways (theatrical, musical, visual, linguistic-creative, etc.), thus becoming a research-action center to experiment with new teaching methodologies and integrate artistic activities with new technologies, enhancing students' skills in various areas of creativity.

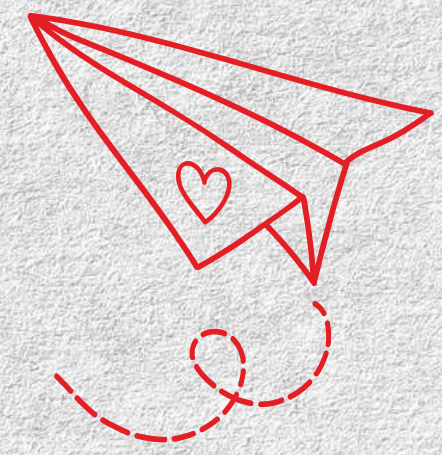
